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### SEMINAR ON WORLD HEALTH DAY: "OUR PLANET OUR HEALTH"

World Health Day under the theme Our Planet Our Health as a part of Azadi ka Amrut Mahotsav, was jointly organized by the Department of Geography, Department of Economics and Department of Commerce, PGSR, S.N.D.T. Women's University, Pune campus, Pune on Thursday, 7<sup>th</sup> March 2022. This programme was divided into two sessions.

### Session I:

First Session commenced at 11:00 am, by the recitation of SNDT Women's University song "Sanskrita Stree Parashkta", in the presence of distinguished guests, Dr. Karuna Jadhav, Neville Wadia Institute of Management Studies and Research, Prof. Sachin Deore, Dean, Faculty of Humanities, Prof Subhash Patil-PGSR Coordinator and Head Department of Economics, Prof. Virendra Nagarale- Head- Department of Geography and Dr. Rashmi Hasamnis- Head-Department of Commerce.

Prof. Subhash Patil gave a brief introduction about S.N.D.T. Women's University and PGSR, Pune Campus. Prof. Patil highlighted the socio-economic aspects of women and also pointed at role of women as a foundation of Indian family system and society. ## History of Economics Department of SNDTWU, Mumbai

The post graduate (PG) department of Economics was established at SNDT Women's University (SNDTWU) in 1972. Prof. Ramesh Panse who was then Head of the Department initiated a 'Rural development Cell' in the department and the department was actively engaged in the activities related to rural development. During his tenure, in 1983, Marathi Arthashastra Parishad's Annual Conference was held at Pune campus of the University. After that conference the 'Marathi Arthashastra Parishad Endowment Annual Lecture' is organised by the Department of Economics. Mumbai, being a financial capital of India, high level of interest in economics as an academic discipline resulted in massive response of students for Master of Arts course. Subsequently, with joining of luminaries such as, Prof. S.K. G. Sundaram, Prof. Avadhoot Nadkarni the Ph. D. programme in Economics attracted scholars from various universities. During Prof. Sundaram's tenure the department had established a Computer Centre. Prof. Avadhoot Nadkarni offered the paper – 'Computer Applications in Quantitative Methods'. M.Phil. in Economics was offered for over a decade and was discontinued in 1993. Both Prof. S.K. G. Sundaram and Prof. Vibhuti Patel had additional charge of Director of Department of Post Graduate Studies and Research (a cluster of Post Graduate Departments of Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences and Commerce). From 2004-05, Gujarati as a Medium of instruction was discontinued but students have an option of writing answers/project reports in English, Marathi, Hindi and Gujarati.

I joined the department as Prof. and head in 2004. I was familiar with the ecosystem of multi-lingual teaching as I had taught as a visiting faculty for the economics department from 1977 to 2001. I was also Director PGSR along with HOD of Economics from 2006 to 2012. Teaching Faculty of economics department of SNDTWU has been known from the very beginning to be guided by team spirit, congeniality, social orientation and kindness towards students from multicultural backgrounds. During my tenure, five of us, Prof. Veena Devasthali (who had additional Charge of Centre for Gandhian Studies), Prof. K.S. Ingole (who had additional charge of Director, Babasaheb Ambedkar Chair), Prof. Ruby Ojha (who is currently Pro-Vice Chancellor of SNDTWU), Dr. Sanjaykumar P. Phad. (who is currently Head of PG Dept. of Economics) and myself worked harmoniously and took responsibilities not only of the department but also of all major and mega events of the SNDTWU. Our department played supportive role towards Undergraduate Departments of Economics located in constituent as well as the affiliated colleges. This spirit of cooperation and congeniality percolated down among our MA students and Ph.D. scholars. In all activities of the Department - seminars, workshops, conferences, student-oriented activities, research, training and outreach activities, both UG and PG department teachers, students, scholars and staff worked with sincerity of purpose and commitment of work ethics. They have a faith in the university's motto that the enlightened women are the backbone of civilization, responsible citizenry and empowerment of human kind. Hence, they are oriented towards holistic education along with technical proficiency in economics.

### The guiding light of the department's academic engagements were as follows:

- To introduce the students to the advanced theories in economics.
- To equip students with analytical tools of economics to understand the current economic reality with perspective of problem solving.
- To introduce the tools of empirical analysis.
- To offer a wide range of courses enabling the students in their pursuit of specialization e.g. Economics of Labour, Industry, Gender, Public and International Economics etc.
- · To organize various curricular and co-curricular academic programmes.

### **Curricular Engagement**

The economics Department has a robust academic programme and state of the art curriculum that includes papers on Microeconomics, Macroeconomics, Economics of Growth & Development, Indian Economy as core components. It offers Optional Papers such as Industrial Economics, Labour Economics, Mathematical Economics, Econometrics, Demography, Agricultural Economics, Economics of Gender and Development, Financial Institutions and Markets, Economics of Infrastructure, Public Economics, International Economics.

#### **Co-curricular Activities**

Major highlights of the department over its existence of 50 years (1972-2022) have been research projects in collaboration with UGC, ICSSR, Planning Commission, NCERT, BMC, Ministry of WCD, UNFPA, UNDP, AIILSG, MMRDA, MAVIM, GOM, GOI etc. Head Office of 'Economics Students-Teachers Association and Resource Centre' is at the department which manages to get sponsorship and organizes various activities like Student's Seminars, Quiz, Elocution, Essay Competitions, capacity building workshops on frontline areas of research; Organization of State / National level Seminars, Panel Discussion, Guest Lectures etc. The department was Co-sponsor of Krishnaraj Memorial Endowment Lecture Series during 2006-2016 and Co-sponsor of Dr. Neera Desai Memorial Lecture from 2010 to 2017. The department is proactive in promoting internship opportunity, providing career guidance and keeping in touch with the members of Alumni Association.

The degree holders of the department have been successful in their **Career Prospects** in Teaching (school, college and university), research, journalism, NGOs, banks, financial institutions, central and state governments etc.

In the 21<sup>st</sup> century, Knowledge Economy, the department has been collaborating with other national / international educational institutions and with government departments and NGOs. It has been our collective dream to strive for making the department a Centre for Advance Studies in Economics.
